<b>Food poisoning (nonspecific)</b>	48 hours symptom free	No

### Exclusion Criteria for Communicable Diseases

<b>Glandular fever</b>	None	No	
<b>Hand, foot and mouth</b>	None	Contact HPU if large numbers of children are affected	
<b>Head lice</b>	None	No	Treatment is recommended
<b>Hepatitis A</b>	7 days from onset of jaundice or from system onset if no jaundice	Yes	Seek advice with HPU if outbreak occurs
<b>Hepatitis B and C</b>	None	Yes	All bodily fluid spills must be cleaned immediately, wearing PPE, dispose of waste such as paper towels as clinical waste
<b>HIV/AIDS</b>	None	No	As above
<b>Impetigo</b>	Until lesions are crusted and healed or 48 hours after commencing antibiotic treatment	No	
<b>Measles</b>	4 days from onset of rash	Yes	Seek advice with regards to vulnerable children (those with reduced immunity) and pregnant staff/visitors
<b>Meningococcal meningitis/septicaemia</b>	Until recovered	Yes	Seek advice from HPU
<b>Meningitis – bacterial</b>	Until recovered	Yes	Seek advice from HPU
<b>Meningitis – viral</b>	None	Yes

<b>Shingles</b>	Only if rash is weeping and cannot be covered	No	Seek advice with regards to vulnerable children (those with reduced immunity) and pregnant staff/visitors who have not already had chickenpox
<b>Slapped cheek/fifth disease/parvovirus B19</b>	None	No	Seek advice with regards to vulnerable children (those with reduced immunity) and pregnant staff/visitors before the 20th week of pregnancy

<b>Tuberculosis</b>	Seek advice from HPU	Yes	
<b>Typhoid/paratyphoid/enteric fever</b>	Seek advice from HPU	Yes	
<b>Warts and verrucae</b>	None	No	Should be covered in swimming pools and changing rooms
<b>Whooping cough</b>	5 days from commencing antibiotic treatment or 21 days from onset of illness if no antibiotic treatment	Yes
